THE ADRIAN EMPIRE ON OVERNIGHT EVENTS

DOES ADRIA HAVE OVERNIGHT EVENTS?

Yes. The usual tournaments and events are one-day events, but there can be a two-day event. The Imperial Crown War is a two-day war that takes place every Labor Day weekend. The Imperial Civil War is also a two-day war that takes place on Memorial Day weekend (if there is no civil war, an Imperial war is still held on that weekend). In addition, many chartered subdivisions also have weekend events, usually a war, but not always.

DOES ADRIA HAVE WEEK-LONG EVENTS?

Not yet. At an Imperial level, Crown and Civil Wars are two-day wars, where people can set up the day before, and tear down the day after.

CAN I BRING MY KIDS?

Yes. Adria is a family-oriented organization and children are always welcome. You will be responsible for your children, though, and must supervise them.

CAN I BRING MY DOGS?

If the event location allows pets, yes. You must always keep your pet on a leash, and keep the leash in your hand. You may not tether your dog or cat and leave them.

CAN I BRING MY LIQUOR CABINET?

You would have to ask the event manager. Some sites allow drinking, and some don't. Some events allows drinking, and some don't.

CAN I FIGHT IF I DRINK?

The rule of thumb is that if you indulge after midnight, you will not be fighting that day. Adria does live-steel combat, and safety is a huge concern. There are no exceptions to this. If you drink (even minutely) you may not fight.

DOES IT COST ANY MORE THAN A NORMAL EVENT?

Usually. The site fees are determined by a variety of costs.

IS THE FOOD PROVIDED?

Sometimes. You would have to check with the event manager. If food is provided, it is usually a feast on Saturday night. If a feast is provided, the site fee is usually higher.

WHERE CAN I GET MORE INFORMATION?

The New Member's Guide has someuseful information about overnight events. FAQ 25: On Camping provides a list of equipment that you might need.
