Safety Corner: Summer

With the coming of summer there are a few safety measures to keep in mind to have a "Safe and Sane Summer". As such I do offer the following food for summertime thought:

- This may sound funny but for any kind of emergency or injury dial 9-1-1.
- In many Western States due to dry vegetation, fire works are restricted or illegal. Be aware of the local laws and regulations governing the use of fire works in your area.
- Campfires are only allowed in designated fire rings in many western states, always monitor your fire and insure the fire is cold before you leave it.
- Many States have "Fire Danger Ratings" be aware of the rating before burning yard trash or other waist products.
- Keep over grown vegetation cut back 25 to 50 feet in rural areas to keep your Estates safe from wild land fires.
- Hot charcoal from Bar-Be-Cuing also need to be soaked in water until cold, never throw Bar-be-cue ash in a trash can if it is still dry. There is a possibility it may be hot enough to start a trash fire.
- Bar-Be-Cues and Hibachis should never be used indoors, or tents as oxygen is depleted and replaced by deadly carbon monoxide.
- Keep lanterns, candles, camp stoves, matches, and lighters in good repair, and away from small children and any combustible material.
- When swimming never leave children unattended.
 Keep floatation devices close at hand. Be a responsible adult.
- When boating always wear and have on hand an approved personal floatation device.
- Always wear your helmet when riding any type of transportation that may require you to.

Tracking Attend-Only Points

Why do people have to sign in when they aren't going to do anything?

Tracking event attendance for game purposes is secondary to the mundane reason we track attendance. As a 501.C.3 non-profit educational organization we have a responsibility to the federal government to track, record, and maintain for a minimum of 7 years the participation of our members - or anyone else - who might declare a charitable cash or non-cash deduction on their taxes related to their attendance at an event (of any kind).

If you are a "short form" person you probably won't know whereof I speak, but persons who itemize their deductions may choose to write off their unreimbursed travel costs (cash) and/or their mileage (non-cash) pertaining to our official events if they are members or if they are non-members who helped out. One of the primary requirements to maintain 501.C.3 status is tracking, recording, and keeping records the IRS can use to verify those deductions if they audit the individual's (or business) tax return. To give you an example of how big an issue this can be, I wrote off in my previous year's Imperial reign over three thousand dollars directly expended on the behalf of Adria between travel costs and phone calls.

Additionally, we have to track attendance for insurance purposes. If an individual files a claim we have to be able to verify whether they were ever at the event to begin with. This is also why we do need to track individual medical incidents with names, though the names should be not given out in public reporting.

Thus you can see why we track attendance with sign-in sheets, and why substitute sign-in sheets could actually constitute fraud... which kind of makes altering sign-in sheets more than just an in-game issue... doesn't it?

"Period" Pot-lucks

A common question amongst newer participants is "what do we eat?" Often a group will plan a "period" potluck luncheon for a Tournament day. Sometimes the newer folks are at a loss as to what to bring.

Only well organized and planned meals allow for a person to bring only fruit or only bread or only one type of dish.

A good rule of thumb is to bring whatever you would eat for lunch. That way if someone fails to show up with their contribution you still have enough to make for a filling lunch and you're not stuck with three loaves of bread and nothing else to eat or the need for a store run.

A little of this and a little of that from a variety of folks makes for an interesting variety of food for lunch and there is nothing more interesting for lunch than exposure to new tastes.

Remember "in-period" means a lot of choices. For now, we can forget the time of year and refrigeration issues ... this is the Middle Ages "how it -should- have been!" Here are some ideas. (I will leave my "eww's" and "yucky's" out and just submit my suggestions.)

Fruit: Apples; small pinkish, yellow or green apples. Try to avoid dark red and overly large apples. Pears - apricots – cooked, dried or fresh.

A favorite in the Empire is lemons or oranges sliced very thin and sprinkled with light raw sugar. Access to the citrus fruits would be limited to travelers and their families, the rich, and those in southern regions especially Spain, the northern Italian states or the Mediterranean-Africa-Middle eastern areas. Remember for much of our 'period' Jerusalem was within the first sphere of influence.

Berries: Avoid cranberries; otherwise most berries available today were eaten in period. Seamen were exposed to tropical fruit, but it didn't last long enough to be introduced on the continent. The exception is pineapples, which weren't popular until the post period 17th century. Pomegranates make a nice garnish.

Grapes: pink, red, black, seeded or not... green grapes are period! They were smaller and probably tasted so much better than they do today. When 'early'

or unripe, grapes would be sour and used to make verjuice. Grapes most commonly though were used to make wine (watered down of course) as it was the most common beverage in most of Western Europe. Coffee, especially the dark rich kinds are period.

Tisanes or herb teas: These were used but generally as a medicinal beverage.

Pickles: Cucumbers, we think of them most commonly but all kinds of vegetables were pickled to preserve and keep them throughout the year, long past harvest time. This includes but is not limited to: pickled mushrooms, marinated pickled vegetables, and eggs.

Olives: Another version of preserving foods for storage similar to pickling - all kinds are period.

Cheeses: white cheeses - herbed cheeses - goat cheese. Slightly yellow cheese is period but not orange colored. Summer-milks are richer and more yellow than other times of the year but nothing like the bright orange we see today. Other dairy choices would depend on the region, social and economic status of the persona. Yogurt is an old friend as is cottage cheese, cream and butter.

Breads: All shapes are fine; round bread is most common. Include crackers and rolls too.

Baked pastry goods: Honey or even sugar (raw or brown is period) sweetened or fruit filled pastry, as good then as it is now.

Meats: Sausages - brats - ham - salami - most sliced deli meats are a good choice.

Roasted meats: Chicken- beef- other fowl

Fish: Hot, cold, pickled, dried; canned fish can be removed from its container and placed on a platter for nibbling with bread or crackers.

Salads: More than you can imagine. European baby greens are a good choice. Vinegar dressings, too.

Potages, soups, stews: These would depend largely on the geographic area and food sources but generally were used to stretch meat resources. Most delicious when mixed with grains like barley, which was enormously popular. Oats and rye were very common as well.

Imperial War Games

These war games will not count toward determining the next Imperial Crown. However, they will count as Imperial Events, and excepted from the one-point-permonth rule.

Archery at the War

Offiste archery is allowed for the entire Empire. The writ with the rules is in the July Herald, and on the Imperial website.

There has been some confusion about offsite archery when the war sites allow onsite archery. Thus the following explanations:

- The East site originally had no archery, therefore the offsite is all that was to be allowed.
- The West currently has archery onsite, but the site has in the past pulled permission at the last minute. Because of this (and the 30-day timing of the writ) Their Imperial Majesties have authorized offsite archery for the War.
- If someone chooses to shoot offsite, they have shot for the War.
- If someone chooses NOT to shoot offsite, 1 of 2 things will happen.
 - 1) They will be allowed to shoot onsite (thus participating in the War), or
 - 2) Onsite shooting will (at the last minute) not be allowed (and they will have missed their chance to participate).
- The scoring will not be complete until the onsite shooting has finished and added to the offsite scores.
- You do NOT get a do-over if onsite archery is allowed (and you have already shot offsite).
- You do NOT count in the offsite shoot unless you have paid the site fee. (Preregistration fees must be postmarked by August 20th).

Arts at the War

A few notes about arts at the Imperial Crown War:

- The listkeeper will make every effort to accomodate artisans who are also combatants, archers, marshals, etc. But it's a two-way street. Please be as available as possible for questions, etc.
- Research papers will be accepted onsite as time allows. If an artisan wishes to enter a research paper, please forward it to Her Imperial Majesty at empress@adrianempire.org. This will allow the judges the time they need to properly evaluate the paper (deadline August 20th please).

Combat

Unto the grand populace of Adria, do I, Sir Arion Hirsch, Imperial Marshal, send greetings. I am greatly appreciative of all those who have organized, collected and sent in the Combat tests all over Adria. We now have nearly 250 qualified combatants in Adria!

Imperial War: Qualification tests for combatants who wish to fight in the upcoming Imperial Crown War will be accepted by this office as long as they are postmarked by August 20th (same day as close of pre-registration). These tests will be included in the list of qualified combatants and authorized marshals used to issue marks to combatants when they sign up at the war. All combatants will be required to show their combat card AND be on the list to get their mark and be allowed to fight. Their Imperial Majesties have declared that combat tests can be sent in in the same envelope as the pre-registration form, saving a stamp. Otherwise, the tests can be sent to:

New Members: New members paying their memberships at the war will be allowed to take the required tests Friday night at the war (Check the schedule at sign-in for the time and place). This will be the ONLY time tests will be given for those new members wishing to fight. Saturday will be a busy day for everyone. Combat cards will be issued to those new members once they have completed the qualification process described in the Marshals Manual.

Please have your Adria Membership Receipt, dated Friday, August 29th, when appearing to take the tests.

Due to the time and limited resources available for testtakers, these new members will be the only people allowed to take combat tests on Friday. Those RENEWING their memberships at the war won't be allowed to take tests Friday night.

One Last Note: The Marshals Manual has been in effect since March 21st of this year. The grace period for compliance (when everyone should have had their tests done and combat cards) was by May 21st. August 21st is 5 full months everyone has had to get the tests in Check the list in the files section of this e-list to see if you are listed.
