We are pleased to make the following announcements, both anxiously awaited by many.

1. Insurance

We have received 2 very favorable bids to date. A broker has contacted us and believes his company can do even better for the Empire, but will not have the bid ready until early next week. Arts Playtest at Banner War

Greetings Unto the Populace of the Empire -

As many of you know the Empire is play-testing a new arts proposal to allow for non-judged arts participations. Their Imperial Majesties have informed us that the play-test will be in effect at the various Banner wars taking place around the Empire. The Arts and Sciences Ministry is very excited about this opportunity for widespread Imperial participation and hope that many people will want to take advantage of it. For those of you unfamiliar with the proposal I'm talking about here is the wording of the Writ:

<u>Arts Manual description of Tournament Entries:</u> 13. Non-judged art activities:

i. The activity must be performed in a visible area by actively participating in a non-judged activity at a Crown tourney and approved by the Crown.

A specific area will be set up.

ii. The activity must be an activity which was performed in Europe during the period covered in our bylaws.iii. Minimum written documentation from the artisan is required to authenticate said activity.

Minimal documentation can be as simple as a couple of primary source pictures or an article or book written by a reputable source i.e. the Museum of London. More obscure art forms may require more documentation to prove authenticity.

iv. The activity must be performed with period tools and equipment, using period techniques. (Substitutions, for safety are allowed as long as the appearance of authenticity is maintained and the substitution is approved in advance by the arts minister and/or Crown.)

v. The non-judged activity must be signed up on the Arts Sign-in sheet in the appropriate List area designated for same.

vi. The activity must meet a minimum time of activity of thirty (30) minutes and verified by the Crown or Arts and Science Minister.

vii. The complexity of the art activity will determine the number of times the artisan may perform a non-judged art activity at a Crown Tourney. The number of participation points to be determined by the Crown and Arts and Science Minister and Artisan before the activity is put on the List.

viii. Non-judged art activities may not be held at Wars. Her Imperial Majesty has stated that Banner War will include an Imperial Tournament, which is acceptable for play test. <u>No War points will be</u> awarded.

Clarification: Non-judged Arts are eligible for entry in the Imperial Tournament held in conjunction with the Arts War event. Non-judged entries will be eligible for EP's, but not WP's. – Dame Aislynne ix. The Imperial Crowns may set additional restrictions

for Imperial Events. There will be a specific area set up for the non-judged arts to be performed. Anyone who would like to participate in a non-judged art must contact the Imperial

Minister, Dame Kendra at <u>rdbrees@sbcglobal.net</u> or the Deputy Imperial Minister, Dame Tara, at renwoman6869@yahoo.com, beforehand to have their

project authenticated and approved. There has been a new project request form to assist with this process. It will be available in the files section at the Adrian Empire yahoo group. It will be available on the Adrianempire.org site pending approval by their Imperial majesties. Please contact us as soon as possible so that we can have your approval to you in time for Banner War.

Conduct of Archery at Banner War

Greetings Unto the Populace

As per the Imperial Bylaws Article XVI, Section 5 regarding conduct of a crown war, Archery war points are to be tallied as follows:

There are 4 war points awarded in archery

- 1. Bowman's List (Combined score of all Bowman's list archers)
- 2. Huntsman's List (*Same as bowman's list except with huntsman archers*)
- 3. Open list (combined total scores of all archers for their candidate regardless of rank, this is a separate shoot, Bowman's list and huntsman's list points from the previous shoots (1 and 2 above are not to be used in this score)
- 4. Champions List. (Per Her Imperial Majesty, each Army's General will choose a champion for the Champion's List shoot.)

There has been confusion in regard to the Archery lists. There is a mistake in the Draft 2004 version, and this error was quoted elsewhere. The lists are delineated in the official version, The Imperial Bylaws 2003 Article XVI.B.

Combat Archery:

Scenarios using combat archery will be announced by the Minister of Joust and War. Combat archers will be subject to arrow inspection during their armor check. This will include deconstruction of 1 (one) arrow to check construction. Any arrow that fails inspection, the archer can opt to have a second arrow checked or have the entire quiver disqualified. If the second arrow fails then the entire quiver is disqualified.

Any arrows missing feathers are to be pulled from the field. Any arrow that falls apart in any way on the field will be pulled. NO FIELD REPAIRS! Anyone field

repairing their arrows will have their quiver disqualified and possibly face disciplinary action. Remember, all we want to do is have fun out there, so let's keep it safe out there.

As I will not be able to attend Banner War West, My deputy Sir Gareth Grae will be handling archery matters that weekend. Help is requested and greatly appreciated on the range. Qualified rangemasters that wish to help should make themselves known to the autocrat Dame Brynna for Western War, Dame Kelda for Northeastern War, and Dame Etaine for Southeastern War

Imperial Sovereign of Arms

Greetings unto the Adrian Empire and the College of Arms,

I wish to thank all the Crown's and Noble's I met with at the recent Imperial Estate's meeting for their kindness and support. It was a great learning and an eye opening experience. I also wish to thank Her Imperial Majesty for letting me keep my "Head" after the chair incident. "All Hail Empress Aislynne de Chartier,"

"All Hail Emperor Wright Bentwood" "Nuff Said".

It takes a great deal of my time and effort to get reports from the subdivisions. I should not have to beg for reports; like any other ministry position, timely reports are essential to the workings of this Office. I implore the Crowns of the Geographic Chartered Subdivisions to encourage their Ministers of Arms to send in reports. Kingdoms and Archduchies, Duchies and Shires should report monthly, Court heralds should report at least quarterly. Reports are due by the 15th of each month. If there is nothing to report, the report is still due – it just has to say "I have nothing to report". At this point in time, an average of only 33% of the subdivisions have reported in the past 5 months. I have yet to receive a Court Herald report.

Education

There are seven recognized Tinctures approved by the College of Arms. They are as follows:

The Colors ~ Gules (Red), Azure (Blue), Vert (Green), Purpure (Purple), Sable (Black).

The Metals ~ Or (Gold), Argent (Silver)

What about Proper Tinctured charges?

"Proper" does not necessarily mean the real color of an item; "proper" is used to mean the default heraldic tincture of the item, which is not necessarily its color in real life. A brown bear proper has brown fur. A dragon proper is Vert with a Gules belly. A sword proper has an Argent blade and an Or hilt. For the purposes of determining if a "proper" item is in violation of the Rule of Tincture, look at it this way: unless it is clearly a Metal (Or or Argent), then it is a Color. That's it. " Vert, a bear proper" is going to be returned for violation of the Rule of Tincture. So will Azure, a dragon proper.

I. THE RULE OF TINCTURE

The Rule of Tincture is defined as follows: *Color may not be placed on Color, nor Metal on*

Metal. This rule is generally inviolable, with certain explicit exceptions as outlined below.

A. SIMPLE ORDINARIES

The so-called simple ordinaries (pale, fess, bend, bend sinister, cross, saltire, chevron, chevron inverted, pall, and pall inverted) may be used in the following manner so long as they contain no complex lines:

- 1. *Gules* ordinary on a *sable* or a*zure* field
- 2. *Sable* or a*zure* ordinary on a gules field

 Ordinaries used in this fashion may be charged, except where such charging would violate the Rule of Tincture.
 Ordinaries used in this fashion may not be cotised in tinctures which violate the Rule of

Tincture.

Did You Know?

The following arms have been registered so that those who do not have the right to bear arms on their own may have something to bear in tournament. They are the Nine Worthies and the Nine Worthy Women.

- Alexander the Great (Mundane) Sable, a griffin or.
- Arthur (Mundane) Azure, three crowns or.
- Boadicea (Mundane) Vert, an equal-armed Celtic cross argent.
- St Brigita of Sweden (Mundane) Per bend gules and azure, a lion argent.
- Caesar (Mundane) Gules, a double-headed eagle or.
- Charlemagne (Mundane) Or, a double-headed eagle sable.
- David (Mundane) Argent, a mullet of six points voided and interlaced azure.
- Deborah (Mundane) Vert, a standing scale argent. (Attributed arms one of the Nine Worthy Women)
- St. Elisabeth of Hungary (Mundane) Azure, a lion barry argent and gules.
- Esther (Mundane) Azure, a crowned portcullis or.
- Godfrey of Bouillon (Mundane) Argent, a Cross of Jerusalem gules
- Hector (Mundane) Or, a lion gules.
- St. Helena (Mundane) Gules, a cross between four furisons or
- Hippolyta (Mundane) Or, a horce forcene gules. (Attributed arms - one of the Nine Worthy Women)
- Joshua (Mundane) Azure, three bull's heads caboshed argent.
- Judah Maccabee (Mundane) Argent, a dragon gules.
- Judith (Mundane) Gules, a wild man's head transfixed by a sword argent.
- Lucretia (Mundane) Argent, a wolf statant sable.




