Shakespeare's Corner

As many of you know, I have been involved with the profession of theatrical entertainments for a good twenty years. In that time, I have somehow managed to produce only a small number of plays by Mr. William Shakespeare. This is by no accident. I have often publically noted my open distain for this man and his many acts of artistic thievery from my beloved homeland. However, something fantastic has occurred to me this month due in large part to my upcoming production of Richard II.

Richard II is the first of Shakespeare's series of history plays which include the two Henry IV plays, Richard III and Henry V. Richard II, set around the year 1398, traces Richard's fall from power (or should I say overthrow) and the rise to power by his cousin Henry Bolingbrook (who is later crowned Henry IV).

When I first approached this project, I realized that this is one the few plays I have not read in the past and I knew very little about it. There are a few notable productions of this work, but overall, it remains one of the Bard's lesser known works. When I sat down to read the play, I noted that it had several epic speeches and a complex cast of characters. It did not exactly leap off the page for me...

It was not until I met with the director that I came to understand both the dramatic and the historical significance of this work. What distinguishes this play from any other is a plot that shows a complete change to the nature of the monarchy. Richard is depicted as the last King of England to believe that his rule was solely ordained by God and his decisions were above the laws of man. As a consequence of this believe, Richard is shown to be selfish and one who concerns himself with the latest fashions and the funding of "pet" wars abroad. He does not behave as a statesman but rather with whatever suits his fancy at the time. And why not? As God's regent on earth, he knows he is infallible.

All seems well until Richard makes a terrible misstep in the banishment of his cousin, Henry Bolingbrook and the eventual seizing of his lands. This leaves Henry with nothing other than an empty title and a hardened heart. Such actions prompt Henry's allies to convince him to return to England and seize the crown. Henry does indeed return to England while Richard is abroad in Ireland. When Richard returns home, Henry has already subdued Richard's supporters and taken control over most of what was Richard's government. Richard quickly realizes his folly and all but begs Bolingbrook to dispose him. The play ends with the crowning of Henry IV and the death (well, murder) of Richard.

The crowning of Henry IV is portrayed as the first of its kind where the seat of power is obtained from the people (that is to say the nobles and great houses) and not the hand of God. This is a very significant shift in the thinking of a nation and marks the birth of the modern populist ruler.

Despite the historical flaws with this depiction of Richard II, it gives us a unique look at the Elizabethan prospective of its former rulers. As the popular entertainment of the time, this play had a tremendous impact on thinking of all persons in England from commoners up to and including Queen Elizabeth herself. In fact, Queen Elizabeth was quoted as saying "I am Richard II, know ye not that?"

Fox and Hare

As the weather grows colder in our northern lands we look for games that can be played indoors (this game can also be played outdoors). One such game that has proven popular is the Fox and Hare. This game was one that was played in England (haven't been able to find a date for it). It is a game that all ages can play and have fun. The game was played with pillows but we have gotten stuffed animals (they are harder to throw). Two pillows are designated as the Foxes, one is the Hare. The game is played by at least 10 people facing each other in a circle (the circle can be much larger). The object of the game is to catch the hare with one of the foxes by passing the objects around the ring from hand to hand, in any direction, and changing directions at will. A person caught holding the hare when the person on either side hands him a fox is out of the game. The circle shrinks to accommodate the loss, and the game continues until there are only seven or eight people left; at which point another round is begun.

The foxes must travel from hand to hand, one person at a time; but the hare, being a spritely creature, may leap across the circle at any time to escape his pursuers. Of course, the game becomes a matter of trying to get rid of the hare more than trying to catch it. The hare is usually tossed to someone about to receive a fox.

Contestants are not allowed to drop the hare to keep from being caught. The foxes should always be passed, not batted, around the circle. Rember the hare cannot catch the fox; if the fox arrives first, being passed or thrown the hare does not disqualify the player.

Try this at one of your events and see how many people you can get to have fun.

Somerset version of Tarock

Another fun indoor card game is Tarok (also known as Tarot and tarocchi), it uses a standard tarot deck. We in Somerset have modified it slightly to be more like the pinochle that we play around these parts.

The game is played by two to six players. The dealer should deal twelve cards to each player, and the remainder set aside (they will not be used during this hand).

Play twelve normal tricks, with the right of the dealer leading the first trick, and the winner of each trick leading the next. You must follow suit if possible; if you cannot, you must play a trump if you have any. If you are void of both the suit led and trump, you may play any card, but will lose the trick. The trick is won by the player who played the highest trump, or the highest card of the suit led if no trumps were played.

THE EXCUSE: The Fool serves as the Excuse: it cannot win a trick, but the player who played the Fool immediately takes it back and replaces it with another card from his winnings. He only needs to surrender the Fool if he never wins any other cards to replace it with.

SCORING: After all the tricks are played, each player totals up his resulting score. If you have won fewer than 12 cards, you lose one point for each card you are short of 12; if you have more than 12 cards, you gain one point for each card above 12. To this total add the following points for each card you hold:

The FOOL (trump 0), 5 points. The WORLD (trump 21), 4 points. The MAGICIAN (trump 1), 4 points. Each King, 4 points. Each Queen, 3 points Each Knight, 2 points. Each Page, 1 point.

A game is played to 50 points. If no one has 50 or more play more hands.
