has become apparent is there is unevenness in skill levels and interpretation in areas like marshalling and arts judging. Particularly since these areas require discretionary judgement even in their most objective practise. We hope to conduct Imperial level collegiums in these areas at future Imperial Events, and to urge the Chivalry to address the inequities in these areas. Especially important are the Arts Masters lists and the shinai lists, which present an important opportunity for interaction between the knighthood and those aspiring to same. Too often We see the knighthood turn its back, ignoring a prime opportunity to fulfill the oath taken to teach. Please all, do your best to serve and aid the Empire in its development by giving your time to those who follow in your foot steps.

Looking Forward

While We are yet hale & hearty, it still behooves Us as rulers to look forward to the eventuality that the throne will pass on to another. We offer some advisory words on the matter. The Imperial Crowns must travel to all of the Imperial Estates Meetings and events, it is not an option. Traveling to meet with the Administrative Board is also a requirement. In addition you should plan on traveling at least once to each of the major subdivisions once per your reign; you cannot have an understanding of regional issues

without doing so. The travel subsidy will not cover all your costs, trust Us. Your phone calls are not reimbursed, so plan on taking on expenses therein. If anyone asks what they can give you for a coronation present, just say "phone cards". In addition you must be connected to the internet. It may be an option for the membership at large, but it is impractical if not irresponsible for anyone to take on a Crown position without having email. The position of

Imperial Crown is one of responsibility and requires good working knowledge of the ongoing issues in the Imperial Estates and the Imperial government. You should have attended the Imperial Estates Meetings for at least a year before attempting to run in order to develop working relations with the other voting members and to be aware of the ongoing legislative issues and their background history. What you don't know will allow you to be manipulated unknowingly by both situations and people, potentially to the detriment of the Empire. If you have gotten where you are by playing personal politics please stay home, the Empire deserves better than that. It must be governed by principle, and administrated in accordance to the law. You should be able to command respect without demanding it. Lastly, remember that you will not have the luxury of deciding to stay home because you

are too tired, too broke, or have to work. With forty to sixty people depending on your presence to conduct the work of the Imperial Estates your attendance is not optional. The Empire is vast and growing, many people depend on you, and you must be there for them. Ah, and one more thing... when you retire from the throne you become a member of the Imperial family (assuming that all went well). Members of the Imperial family serve as representatives, and generally make themselves available to the current administration when needed for background history, advice, and potentially



undertake special projects (such as helping to run events, ambassadorial functions, etc). Be prepared for a lot of people to open their hearts to you, expect to spend a lot of time listening, and be quick to apologize for things you have no control over that happen on your watch. Your administration is you, and your minister's mistakes and foibles your burden. Be prepared to hear "I'm afraid I won't be able to do justice to the office" when seeking Imperial Ministers. They know that filling the position makes them a target for 1000 people, most whom they've never even met. Remind them that only a few people are compulsively mean, and they can always forward them to you to handle. You will have to be strong enough to be kind, and responsible enough to do the hard deed. Last of all, you should know what that means. The Imperial Crowns should, after all, be both leaders and representatives of the Chivalry.

So, having laid out such advice & observances We wish you well. May you bring a good heart with you, and serve the Empire well.

For Imperial Banner War the Emperor attended the Western Imperial Banner War in the Kingdom of Terre Neuve while We journeyed to the Northern Realm Banner War in the rapidly growing Duchy Caerleon. Fifty two members of the populace of Caerleon, their cantons, and Ekateringerod gathered for war in the mountains of Idaho amidst the blooming Thimbleberry and Lupines along the Clearwater River to await the arrival of the Empress. Their hospitality proved to be formidable, as We enjoyed the courtesies of the food & lodging they provided. We feasted on Winter Sallet of Cabbage, Spiced Meat in Pastry, Fine Carrots, Beef done in fine dark ale & onions, Macarone Noodle in Cheese, fine Cheeses, Breads, and a subtlety presentation of a Fleurde-Lis in bread for the Saturday night fete. Imperial Crown Contenders

Members of the populace who wish to vie for the Imperial Throne shall submit letters of intent to the Imperial Chancellor by July 1, 2001. The letter must indicate the prospective Crown, the Crown's Consort and whether or not the proposed Consort is to be a Co-Ruler, or titled Consort only. If the Consort is to be a co-ruler, then both parties must meet all eligibility requirements. If the Consort is to have no sovereign power the consort need only be a member in good standing with at least 6 months membership. Please identify both game name, mundane name, your subdivision, and contact information (address, phone, and email). Be advised that the Crown is the President of the Adrian Empire, and that the Consort serves as Vice President. Should the Consort not be a co-ruler, anotherwards a titled Consort only, the Imperial Chancellor serves as Vice President. All parties should be advised that the annual corporate filing with the State of Arizona includes a disclosure statement regarding officers of the Corporation. Concerning Imperial Events:

Lo these many years We have noticed some areas of general uncertainty to address for the benefit of all.

- Site Autocrats are appointed representatives of the Imperial Crowns. When you speak to them you are speaking to Us, as they are our agents. Any problems with their conduct should similarly be taken up with Us.
- 2. The site layout for the events are laid out to the purpose of the event, and with the intention of benefiting all by providing for efficient operation. This includes designating certain areas for battlefield, spectators, court functions, and autocrating and governmental areas. The Site Autocrat has the responsibility to keep these areas for their intended use. Please help them.
- 3. There are Imperial Wars, such as the Banner & Crown Wars, and Imperial Tournaments. Imperial Tournaments are held at the discretion of the Imperial Crowns. In order to facilitate availability to the most people and to capitalize on the efforts they have already made to travel We have chosen to hold them in tandem with the Imperial Wars at the same sites. The Tournaments are not part of the War. Tournament participations and wins are separate from the Imperial Wars, and should be accounted for accordingly.
- 4. Persons in attendance at Imperial events who have not signed-in or registered are not officially in attendance. This has several impacts. There being no record of your attendance negates your ability to write off the trip expenses on your taxes; leaves you not covered by site or event insurance; and will prevent you from garnering any participations or points associated with the event.
- 5. Even if your local Steward has stayed abreast of their monthly reporting, it is possible that your membership will take five weeks just to get to the Imperial Steward's office. If you turned it in just after their reporting it would be four weeks till they mail it, another week to deliver, and another

to process. This is assuming they are up to date in their reporting, which the average subdivision is not. Some subdivisions have been up to 6 months behind in turning in their member's renewals during our reign. Mailing your membership directly to the Imperial Steward's office will expedite the process. You are a member of the Empire; you reside in a subdivision. Your dues go to the Imperial government; turning them in locally only doubles the work for your own Steward and delays your renewal. If you wish to turn your membership in through your local Steward's office, we advise that you make a copy of your form and check and carry it with you till the renewal is verified.

6. There is always more work to do than workers to do... please consider volunteering to help. To "maintain horse and harness" means to be ready to serve, "forty days of riding" is the service owed by all knights to their Crown; consider the Imperial events your chance to prove the first and fulfill the second if you are a member of the Chivalry. If you are not, then consider it a chance to prove your worthiness to be one. Either way, all will benefit.

FROM THE SUBDIVISIONS


Greetings from Aragon
