

We are growing and have been establishing several new, renewed, subdivisions and expect more on the horizon. Many of these smaller subdivisions need assistance in getting the necessary equipment together so they can hold Events and recruit. If you, or your subdivision, are interested in helping out by passing down used or new equipment, please contact us directly. ## Gorgets 101: A guide to what is required





Above are dog collar style gorgets and are not allowed to be used without clavicle protection.



This would have to be added to make the dog collar legal for use on its own.



This is a complete steel legal gorget. All gorgets should offer the same coverage as this one: front, sides and back of the neck, top of the breastbone, and clavicle coverage.

This is the most basic form of acceptable gorget. Simple leather of 6oz or better riveted with quick rivets. I do have to take notice that the front should ALWAYS overlap the back. This picture demonstrates what looks to be the back overlapping the front which could cause a thrust to catch and choke a person. The front side should always be the longer side.





Even with the bib on this mask, a gorget must be used. Padded bibs alone are not sufficient protection, even in shinai!



## COMBAT AND MARSHELING TEST GRADING PROCEDURE

The test on the next page was done to show how I would like all tests in the empire to be graded.

Questions 5, 6, 8, 11, 14, and 16 are all wrong as marked by a large X over their # (next to due to formatting restrictions)

Question 5 has one to many answers chosen as indicated by the pink X. This lets the test taker know which choice was not correct and should be reviewed with the test taker by the administrator.

Question 6, 8, 14, and 16 all have wrong answers marked (pink highlighting shows the correct answer for review by the combatant.) These are questions the test administrator should go over with the test taker before allowing them to retest. Show them where the answers are to be found and allow them to retake the test if need be.

Question 11 is a multiple choice question in which the test taker did not circle all the right answers. Simply highlight the rest of the correct answers and mark it wrong. Again, the administrator of the tests should go over wrong answers with the test taker and show them where to find the proper answers before allowing them to retake the test.

To figure out the percentage I do it the long hard way because I'm not all that great with math (thank god for calculators!)

100/16 = 6.25 100 divided by # of questions in the test.

This gives you the # of points each question is worth

6.25x6=37.50 Take that answer and multiply it by the # of questions missed.

This gives you the total # of points they missed

100-37.50=62.50 Now subtract that # from 100 and round to the nearest whole number.

This is the percentage which should be recorded on the tests at the top right section where it says SCORE.

When grading the tests, please try to follow this example as best you can to prevent all the miscellaneous marks on the tests as they are legal documents. *Please make sure the tests are SIGNED by both the person taking the tests and the authorized Minister of Joust and War for your local subdivisions.*

#### From the Imperial Minister of Education

Unto the Empire of Adria, Greetings.

It is my continued honor to serve you as Imperial Minister of Education (IMoE). I will take some insight from my goode cousin, Sir Duncan Wallace, and introduce myself and the Ministry of Education.

I am Dame Eiliagh d'Aitzarra, Knight Minister. I joined Adria in August of 2004 in the Kingdom of Terre Neuve. I have been Hospitaler and Minister of Arts & Sciences for Terre Neuve. I am currently Vicereine of the Shire of Bisqaia.

For those who know me, you know I am very enthusiastic when I am doing something I really like. One of the things I that intrigued me about Adria is there is SO much learning going on. We teach people to fight, shoot, document and do arts or to play their persona. This made me really excited, because I love learning about the medieval time period.

In fact, learning about the medieval time period (specifically 1066-1603AD) is the foundation of our organization. Some will argue that this is "just a game" and that we can "play" it however we see fit. But we are bound by certain guidelines for which we are held accountable to the mundane world.

Adria is a 501c3 Educational Non-Profit Organization. We are required to maintain records and verification that we are fulfilling our mundane obligations, which is to provide and present education. If we don't abide by those guidelines, we can lose our charter as a 501c3.

The Imperial Ministry of Education is split into two areas: Ministry of Children's Activities & Ministry of Education.

I have Deputies – Ministers of Children's Activities in the West, North East and South East. If you are in one of those regions, you are required to report all children's activities and classes to your Regional Deputy. Central reports will be sent to me. All Deputies will be announced in **next month's** Adrian Herald and on the Adrian Empire Yahoo!Group. If your subdivision does not have a Minister of Children's Activities, it is the ruling Crown's responsibility to report to the appropriate Imperial Minister. All reports are due by the **first of the month**. If no children's activities happen in a month, send a report with the message: **No Children's Activities This Month**.

We share our education in two very distinct ways in Adria. We give *classes* (also known as collegia) and we primarily educate ourselves as an organization to make sure we're learning about our time period. We do *demonstrations* (demos) and we primarily educate people outside of Adria (for example schools, scouts, libraries) to make sure we're helping others learn about our time period.

In order to maintain Imperial Records of all classes and demonstrations given in Adria, the Imperial Ministry of Education requires:

An instructor must provide a syllabus and documentation before a class may be approved. It must be approved and published at least 30 days before the class is given. This includes classes at demos.

A demo must be approved and published at least 30 days before the demo occurs.

All Subdivisions must turn in monthly reports by the <u>first of the month</u>. If a Subdivision does not have a Minister of Education, then it is the responsibility of the ruling Crown to submit the report.

Reports to the Ministry of Education will be emailed and will include:

If nothing educational (class or demo) happens, send a report with the message: **No Educational Activities This Month**.

<u>For each demo given in the subdivision</u> - autocrat, location date time & duration of demo, who attended, who was the audience & how many, what was presented for Archery, Arts & Sciences, Combat, & history, is this a first time demo or a repeat (requested to return), how many times has the demo been done at that location, was Adria asked to return for another demo.

<u>For each class approved and given</u> – instructor, subject material for the class, the syllabus, all documentation/sources & handouts for the class (scanned or computer documents), location date time & duration of class, attendance at the class, is the Instructor a Knight.

As Knights of the Empire we take an oath to teach what we know and learn what we do not. It is in the spirit of this oath that the Ministry of Education requests **Knights** to teach at least one class (as per the bylaws) per year. This does not include teaching a squire or other vassal.

#### Vital Signs 101: Scabies; The Rash With Bite

**Scabies: 1)** Latin meaning "You Itch". **2)** An infection characterized by a rash, itching, and small thread like "tunnels" in the skin. It is transmitted by close contact with an affected person, sharing of towels, linens, and other personal belongings. Because of the media of transmission it often affects many members of the same household even before the onset of the first symptoms.

Scabies is transmitted by a specific species of mite that is attracted to the warmth of the human body. This mite has extremely limited mobility but can be transferred fro host to host through close physical contact (Anybody share armor around here?). These mites can live for up to 4 days without a human host and, following infection, it can be as many as four to six weeks before a carrier begins to show the signs or symptoms of being infected. Scabies does not go away on its own and requires treatment by a licensed medical professional to purge the infestation from your body.

Symptoms may include itching and irritated skin with markings that look like tiny curving tacks. Occasionally you can also see a blister on the skin or a tiny black dot at the end of the track. There may also be pain & swelling of the affected area and a fever of over 100° F (37.8° C). Your risk for contracting scabies is highest if you are (or are frequently around) people who work in nursing homes or prisons or live in crowded conditions.

**Did you know?** The plague, which decimated the population of Europe several times during the Medieval and Renaissance periods, is also carried by a small pest, the common flea. Early symptoms of the plague include a rash and fever – let's hope that these similarities are the closest any of us come to contracting the plague.

Stay tuned next month for our article on Hypothermia, and what to do if you suspect someone of having it.

Now, some of you are wondering "If this is Physicker related material in "Vital Signs 101" why is he off talking about Scabies?" I work at a major hospital in the Duchy of Cambridge where there have been several outbreaks of scabies in the past several months. These outbreaks have infected not only patients and staff but also the family and friends of these staff members. These outbreaks serve as a reminder to all of us to observe the policy of wearing gloves when treating a patient. ALL Physickers and their assistants should observe this policy when treating a patient for pretty much anything. While you may not get scabies, you could get any variety of other nasty, blood or body fluid borne illnesses, including Hepatitis, HIV/AIDs, or a bunch of other icky little bugs that were euphemistically referred to by Queen Victoria as "social diseases" (and really, what disease isn't social?).

Now, allow me to expand the definition of what will be included within this column. Our primary focus is on common ailments that Physickers might need to treat. Every few months, we will feature something on the history of Medieval Medicine or a Public Health issue (that would be what we did this month). ### From the new Imperial Office of Information

For the last several months, it has been my honor to serve you as your Imperial Chronicler; as of this past estates meeting I have taken on more responsibilities and a new title. This office is now the "Imperial Office of Information". Previously in Adria, the Office of Publishing was headed by one person who was responsible for publishing the Herald, maintaining websites, reviewing manuals, and basically going over anything that was to be put in print (electronic or paper). This office was divided up over time and duties redirected to various other offices either newly created or existing. The Imperial Office of Information is an attempt to bring everything back under one heading again.

There are several main focal points of this office:

- Ensuring the Empire's presence on the internet is up-to-date and professional
- Increasing our internet exposure with search engines
- Expanding our internet presence with additional resources
- Publication and expansion of the Adrian Herald
- Review/edit of publication materials (electronic and print) to ensure a portrayal of professionalism

The biggest change that will be noticeable by the populace will be our internet presence. It is our belief that due to the limited resources on our website, we are not getting as much exposure as we should. If you type in the name of some medieval recipe into a search engine, you are pretty much going to be directed to at least one site that is controlled by or has a reference to the SCA. And it does not matter what subject you look up, if it is medieval in nature, then the SCA is listed in reference to it somehow. This is a HUGE benefit to their organization as it directs people who may not even know they exist but are interested in historic subjects to their pages. As a result, when they decide to join a group it is one of the first they think of based solely on the vast amount of information they present. Hence it is one of our main priorities to increase the amount of exposure we have by increasing the amount of resources we offer to the public.

Secondly, we are going to make an effort to ensure that all subdivisions have representation on the internet. For those that do not currently have a site, this office will assist in the creation of such and offer on-going support when needed. This office will also be looking at current sites hosted by subdivisions and will be suggesting that any site which is hosted on a server that forces advertisements in the form of banners or pop-ups be relocated due to the empire's lack of control over what advertisements are displayed. In today's internet advertising climate, webhosts are constantly changing their ideology on what they will allow. We can not afford to have an Adrian related site displayed in a browser that has less than desirable advertising content displayed on it as well. Efforts are already underway to provide for advertisement free hosting space for all subdivisions with the Empire's hosting company.

Third, you can expect to see the Adrain Herald continue to be published and grow in size. Several new features are still in the works and will be making their premier appearances soon. The online version of the Herald which is no where near complete but is up and running now (www.adrianherald.org) will also be growing and offering more and more interactivity for our members. Additionally, this site will be merged with our main site to create one very large and easy to navigate website. Members of the populace will have more than enough things to keep them busy and entertained, while we also provide plenty of information for those just looking around.

To achieve our goals, I am asking for the cooperation of everyone. There are several things I would like to ask.

If you are the owner of a YaHoo group that is Adria related please contact me to ensure we have a complete list. I also ask that you ensure that the user "Adrian-Moderator" is a member of the group and has been made an owner. This is only to prevent the loss of the group due to unforeseen events. There have been instantances where the owner of a group has lost access to their account or something and then we have not been able to control the group. This account is not used to do anything within the group except prevent this from happening. To date, only 9 groups have made the change to make this account an owner; 7 more have it listed as moderator only. This announcement was made some time ago and is not acceptable. This is a required change to protect the interests of the Empire in the future. Please follow through with this.

If you are the webmaster of an Adrian related site, please contact me. If you are considering starting a site for your subdivision, please contact me as well.

If you would like to assist with this office in ANY capacity, contact me. Considering the expanse of the undefined duties of this office, I am sure that I will be needing help.

Finally, patience.... There is a lot to do and it is going to take time.





## **Wooden Maces**

Jousters travelled from land to land, like modern cricketers on their tours, offering and accepting challenges. Thus Edward I, before coming to the throne, led eighty knights to a tournament on the Continent. Before the jousts at Windsor on St George's Day in 1344 heralds published in France, Scotland, Burgundy, Hainault, Flanders, Brabant and the domains of the emperor the king's offer of safe conduct for competitors. At the weddings of princes and magnates and at the crowning of kings the knights gathered to the joustings, which had become as much a part of such high ceremonies as the banquet and the minstrelsy. The fabled glories of the Round Table were revived by princely hosts, who would assemble a gallant company to keep open house and hold the field again t all corners, as did Mortimer, the gueen's lover, when, on the eve of his fall, he brought all the chivalry of the land to the place where he held his Round Table. About 1292 the "Statute of Arms for Tournaments" laid down, "at the request of the earls and barons and of the knighthood of England," new laws for the game. Swords with points were not to be used, nor pointed daggers, nor club nor mace. None was to raise up a fallen knight but his own appointed squires, clad in his device. The squire who offended was to lose horse and arms and lie three years in gaol. A northern football crowd would understand the rule that forbade those coming to see the tournament to wear harness or arm themselves with weapons. Disputes were to be settled by a court of honour of princes and earls. That such rules were needful had been shown at Rochester in 1251, where the foreign knights were beaten by the English and so roughly handled that they fled to the city for refuge. On their way the strangers were faced by another company of knights who handled them roughly and spoiled them, thrashing them with staves in revenge for the doings at a Brackley tournament. Even as early as the 13th century some of these tournaments were mere pageants of horsemen. For the Jousts of Peace held at Windsor Park in 1278 the sword-blades are of whalebone and parchment, silvered; the helms are of boiled leather and the shields of light timber. No other event lists these types of weapons and most were fought with rebated (blunted) swords and some with stylised wooden maces. But the game could make rough sport. Many a tournament had its tale of killed and wounded in the chronicle books. We read how Roger of Lemburn struck Arnold de Montigny dead with a lance thrust under the helm. The first of the Montagu earls of Salisbury died of hurts taken at a Windsor jousting, and in those same lists at Windsor the earl's grandson Sir William Montagu was killed by his own father. William Longéspee in 1256 was so bruised that he never recovered his strength, and he is among many of whom the like is written.

In King Rene's Book of the tournament, specific mention is made of the types of weapons allowed in tournament play. One of these is the wooden mace. Many of these maces were carried by by nobility and were stylised and made more personal in nature. One of these ways was by having their mace turned by a wood turner on a lathe. Kings would also have their Ceremonial guards carry these maces as symbols of protection for the King. This is where we get the ceremonial maces of most universities today.

The wood turner would take whatever wood or woods he was working with, laminate them together, then place them in his bow lathe. He would then get his apprentice to move the bow back and forth, creating the energy needed for the turner to remove pieces from the wood to create the finished product. The mace produced here is is maple and mahogany, and was a present to the King of Umbria upon his second Coronation.

#### SPLIT PEA SOUP WITH BEANS AND ONIONS (English 15th Century)\_

#### Ingredients:

1 cup Split green peas 5 cups Water

4 Tbl Olive oil 1/4 lb Green beans

1 tsp Salt 3 lg Onions, sliced

1/4 tsp Ground black pepper
